CONSCIENTIAL SELF-EVOLUTION AND DOCTORATE

The doctoral program is perhaps a unique period in life when researchers, still in their formative stages, devote themselves exclusively and in depth, over four years or more, to a specific research problem. It is common and expected for the work to reach the roots or epistemological foundations of the discipline in question. By dealing directly with the paradigm of the discipline, the researcher can revisit the foundations of their own worldview or self-paradigm. Hence the correlation between doctorate and consciential evolution, including the paradigm and the self-paradigm.

This issue of *Interparadigmas* aims precisely to promote the study of cases of this correlation, to better understand how it happens and how it can become synergistic to the researcher's consciousness. The consciential paradigm, the theoretical-methodological model of Conscientiology, makes this synergy even more significant, since the expansion of the notions of reality and experience is at stake through parapsychic interactions with multidimensionality.

In the article *Units of Lucidity and Synergies in the Reconstruction of the Self-Paradigm*, Cilene Gomes presents and reflects on her experience of integration between space and time, based on her doctoral studies and also on conscientiological research.

In the text *Socin and Sociex - Paradigmatic Approximations Behind the Scenes of the Doctorate*, Marina Vinha exposes correlations between the theories of the civilizing process and reurbex, developed as a result of her doctorate.

Cecília Oderich, author of *Behind the Scenes of a Thesis: Borders, Organizational Movements, and Multidimensionality*, shares the recycling she experienced during her doctorate, especially regarding the concept of organization, whether institutional and/or consciential.

The report *Solid Waste Recycling - Intraconscientility Crescendo*, by Jacinta dos Santos, shows the interparadigmatic bridge she experienced during her doctoral studies, connecting Brazil and Spain interassistantially.
